2021 was an incredible year for Miriam's House! We served a total of 23 women and 15 children, providing around the clock care and support for our families including: Housing, nutrition, social services, weekly goal assessments, 12 step meetings, and parenting support.

A Place to Call Home

After leasing our property for 15 years, we completed a successful capital campaign and purchased the property that over 350 families have called home!

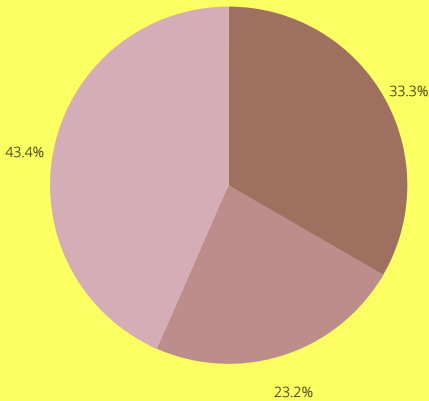

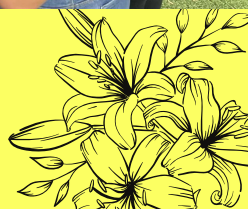
